



## AUTHOR GUIDELINES

### AIMS AND SCOPE

*The journal provides as a medium for the communication, update and exchange of ideas and experience in anesthesia, critical care medicine and allied disciplines. It is intended to all involved in the medical sciences. Particularly physicians, anesthetists and intensivists, emergency doctors, surgeons, pediatricians, radiologists; nurses of these areas and all concerned with the basic medical science and clinical research to these disciplines.*

Required information pertaining to the manuscript includes the full name, address, telephone number, and E-Mail address for the first author and all contributing authors; affiliated institutions. Each manuscript submission should designate one corresponding author and all contributing authors. The numbers of authors should be restricted to only those persons who have truly participated in the conception, design, execution, and writing of the manuscript. Authors must disclose any potential financial or ethical conflicts of interest regarding the contents of the submission.

SIARED accepts no responsibility for manuscripts that are lost or destroyed through electronic or computer problems. Authors are encouraged to keep copies of submitted manuscripts, including figures.

All Articles are reviewed by independent reviewers before an editorial decision is made. Authors are advised of the editorial decision as soon as it is available.

**Copyright.** Copyright ownership is to be transferred in a written statement, which must accompany all manuscript submissions and must be signed by the corresponding Authors.

**Financial Disclosure.** Any author who has a financial involvement with any organization or entity with a financial interest in or in financial competition with the subject matter or materials discussed in the manuscript should disclose that affiliation.

**Human and Animal Subjects.** All studies of human subjects must contain a statement within the Materials and Methods section indicating approval of the study,

that subjects have signed written informed consent. All animal studies must contain a statement within the Materials and Methods section that the study was approved by the Institutional Review Board for the care of animal subjects and that the care and handling of the animals were in accord with National Institutes of Health guidelines or some other internationally recognized guidelines for ethical animal research.

**Statistical Review.** Any study containing quantitative data and statistical inference should be reviewed by an expert.

### MANUSCRIPT PREPARATION

Manuscripts must conform to these presents Author Guidelines or the "Uniform Requirements for Manuscripts Submitted to Biomedical Journals," which can be found on the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors web site, [www.icmje.org](http://www.icmje.org). Manuscript should be written for the first submission in Italian or English. Translation into the second language will be requested after the revision process has been completed, before the publication. Manuscripts should be formatted with a serif font (Times New Roman 12 is preferred), double-spaced with pages numbered consecutively, beginning with the title page. Word Processor fonts or the Symbol font should be used for special characters. All text and tables should be saved in Rich Text Format (RTF) or Document Format (DOC). All figures should be saved as separate files and not included into the text.

### MANUSCRIPT CONTENT

**Title Page.** The title page should contain: A. concise and informative title not exceeding 90 characters, a short subtitle may be added; B. first name, middle initial, and last name of each author; C. highest academic degrees, and institutional affiliation for each author. Structured abstracts are required for all manuscripts (except editorials, letters, and book reviews) submitted to the SIARED Journal.

**Abstracts.** Abstracts should be no more than 300 words in length and must have the following headings:

- **Objective:** the exact question(s) addressed by the article.
- **Design:** the basic design of the study.
- **Setting:** the location and the level of clinical care.
- **Patients** (for Clinical Investigations) or **Subjects** (for Laboratory Investigations), the manner of selection and number of patients involved or the description of the subject of the study.
- **Interventions:** the exact treatment or intervention, if any.
- **Measurements and Main Results:** the method of assessing patients and key results.
- **Conclusions:** key conclusions including direct clinical applications.

Review papers and special articles should use these headings in the abstract: Objective, Data Sources, Study Selection, Data Extraction, Data Synthesis, and Conclusions.

**Key words.** Six key words for indexing, using terms from the Me-

dical Subject Headings list of Index Medicus **Text Material**. The text should be organized into the following sections:

- **Introduction:** should explain the rationale of the study through a short review of the pertinent literature, and state the purpose of the investigation.

- **Materials and Methods:** should provide enough information to permit repetition of the experimental work. Should include a statistical section.

- **Results:** should describe the outcome of the study. Data should be presented as concisely as possible, if appropriate in the form of tables or figures. Results should not be duplicated in the text and in the tables or figures.

- **Discussion:** should be an interpretation of the results without unnecessary repetition, describing their limits and their significance with reference to work by Authors.

- **Conclusions:** should summarize results of research and should give answer to the outlined objectives.

- **Acknowledgments:** personal acknowledgment should precede those of institutions or agencies

- **References:** All references should be cited in sequential order in the text and typed on a separate sheet of paper. References should be identified in text, tables, and legends by full-size Arabic numerals and in square parentheses. Do not use word processing footnote, endnote, or paragraph numbering functions to make a list of references. Titles of journals should be abbreviated according to the style used in Index Medicus. If journal titles are not listed in Index Medicus, they should be spelled out. Unpublished data or personal communications should be noted parenthetically within the text but not in the References section. Inclusive page numbers should be used for all references. - **Tables and Figures.** The number of figures and tables should be appropriate for the length of the manuscript. All tables and figures should be cited in sequential order in the text. If a figure has been published previously (even if you were the author), acknowledge the original source and submit written permission from the copyright holder to reproduce the material where necessary. The authors are responsible for obtaining permissions to use material owned by others.

- **Tables.** Tables can be saved within the text of the manuscript and should be typed single-spaced and numbered sequentially using Arabic numbers. Do not reiterate tabular data in the text. Do not use abbreviations in table titles. Do not use all capital letters in table headings and text. Do not underline or draw lines within tables. Avoid lengthy footnotes and insert descriptive narratives in the text.

- **Figures.** Images must be saved as separate files and send with the text. Although many file formats are acceptable, .jpg and .tif are preferred. For printing purposes final images are required to be 266 dpi. Figure legends should be concise, contain enough information for the reader to understand the illustration without referring to the text, and should not repeat information already stated in the text. Figure legends should be typed on a separate page.

- **Equations.** Equations should be created as normal text or as images.

- **Manufacturer.** Provide in parentheses the model number, name of manufacturer, city, and state or country for all equipment described in the paper.

- **Drug Names.** Only generic drug names should be used. Trademark or brand names should not be used except in specific cases where the brand name is essential to reproduce or interpret the study. The manufacturer with the city, state, and country must be provided for any brand name drugs.

In addition, the following should be observed:

1. The full term for which an abbreviation stands should be used at its first occurrence in the text unless it is a standard unit of measure. The abbreviation should appear in parentheses after the full term. Abbreviations should not be in the title, figure legends, or table titles.

2. Authors should provide units of measurement in SI units. For standard unit of measure please refer to The International System of Units (SI) available online at <http://www.bipm.org/en/si/>

3. Please provide  $r^2$  values for parametric data.

### PROOF AND REPRINTS

Prior to publication proof pages process will be performed. Authors are allowed to correct mistyping errors but not to alter the text. The corresponding Author will receive the pdf file of the manuscript. Reprints can be ordered at cost of the authors.
